Davos Documentation Library

The documentation library is an indispensable aid for researching the history of Davos. It preserves historical knowledge about the development of the Davos landscape. Its holdings include over 20,000 media (manuscripts, books, periodicals, graphics, sound recordings, DVD and video films) that have a connection to Davos. In addition, the DBD has an important photo collection with more than 9,000 photographs. The three most important Davos periodicals (Davoser Blätter, Davoser Revue and Davoser Zeitung) are complete in the collection.

The documentation library is a reference and study library. Photocopies can be made of many documents. Research outside opening hours is possible. The documentation library is open to all residents and guests.






